Happy New Year 1981

Once upon a time many years ago - way back in the 60's - there was a dreamer by the name of Ransom J. Arthur, M.D. Dr. Arthur learned to swim at the age of four and has always loved aquatics. For over 20 years, he swam competitively for the Navy, competing in both armed forces and AAU meets.

For a number of years Dr. Arthur attempted to interest officials in what later became the Masters Swimming program. His efforts met with no success until John Spannuth, who was then President of the American Swim Coaches Association, took an active interest in the proposal and together they launched the first Masters Swimming Championships in Amarillo, Texas, in May 1970. A team of eight Navy doctors made extensive tests on the participants. Swimming was found to be one of the most healthful forms of exercise and regular exercise results in benefits to the cardiovascular-respiratory systems. The aging process can be slowed down by a daily exercise program and regular exercise lowers the level of serum cholesterol. Swimming on a regular basis can help prevent coronary disease.

In 1971, the second Masters Swimming Championships were again held in Amarillo with three times the number of participants in the first meet. Mr. Spannuth contacted June Krauser and asked her to write up a set of rules for the Masters Swimming Program that could be presented to the AAU Swimming Committee. Having experience as National Chairman of the Swimming Rules Committee, the Age Group Rules Committee and the Junior Olympic Rules Committee, June wrote up the first set of rules for Masters Swimming which were presented at the AAU's National Convention in Lake Placid, New York, in October 1971. The Joint Swimming Committee voted to adopt and promote the Masters Swimming Program as an official AAU Activity. Dr. Ransom Arthur was elected the first Chairman of the AAU Masters Swimming Committee.

And so on January 1, 1972, the official AAU

Masters Swimming Program was launched! As an AAU program it was given identity, and a network of volunteers to help promote and officiate at meets all over the country. The program was designed as a physical fitness program to encourage people to swim on a regular basis and to be concerned about their physical fitness. Most of the top swimmers in our country are usually through with competition when they graduate from college and so as not to conflict with our other swimming programs the starting age for the Masters program is 25. The age groups are currently broken down into 5-year groupings with 90+ being the last age group. Summing up the reasons for the Masters Swimming program - first is HEALTH - physical fitness; second is FUN - social aspect; and third is SPORT - compet

Masters Swimming has room for all types. It allows long-term competitors to continue a career that may have begun long ago. It encourages old competitors to return to the sport. And it reserves space for those who've never competed. All three categories have contributed to the records. Apparently it's never too late to atone for sins of over-indulgence and under-exercise.

Dr. Arthur served as chairman for 1972-73. June Krauser followed as Chairman for 1974-75-76-77. Our current chairman, Ted Haartz is serving his fourth year. Not many changes have been made in the original program. Many swimmers still do not know that the program exists but with promotion and publicity more will be informed. We have continued to encourage foreigners to enter our meets in hopes that they will promote the program in their countries.

Since the Athletic Act of 1978, 'swimming' has been in a turmoil. The UNITED STATES AQUATIC SPORTS, INC. has been formed which encompasses Swimming, Diving, Water Polo and Synchronized Swimming. The 'new' name for swimming is U.S. Swimming. Masters Swimming is also in the process of change. However, the program remains the same - encouraging people to swim on a regular basis - so for 1981 - CONTINUE VIGOROUS SWIMMING FOR HEALTH, FUN AND SPORT!

SCOTTISH NEWS

Olympic gold medallists and former world record holders from the U.S.A. joined the 150 competitors in the Kalback Lager Scottish Masters Championship at Greenock on December 6 and 7 in what turned out to be a splendid show-case for the fast-growing sport in Britain.

The American stars invited to help boost masters' swimming were John Naber, Jim Montgomery, Bruce Furness, Rod Strachan, Steve Clark, Lance Larson and Donna DeVarona. They joined British Olympic gold medallists Duncan Goodhew and David Wilkie, Murray Rose - Australia, Nobuti Taguchi - Japan, Kiki Caron - France, and Walter Kusch - West Germany.

They quickly helped establish the unique atmosphere of masters swimming combining fun, friendship and serious competition. Among the other stars of the past taking part were former world record holder Bobby McGregor, Elenor Gordon former Commonwealth breaststroke champion and Olympic bronze medallist, Peter Heatly former Commonwealth diving champion, now chairman of the Scottish Sports Council, Margaret McDowell, Olympic backstroke finalist, and Jack Hale of Hull, whose incredible international swimming career started in the 1930's and went on into the late 1950's when he pioneered the dolphin kick.

The Championship was given a further boost by the entry of 35 masters competitors from West Germany many of whom had come to renew friendships with the established British masters swimmers like Terry Boyes of York, Willy van Rysel from Bournemouth, Vivienne Cherrimen, Isle of Wight and Alex Watters, Royal Navy.

The most spectacular race of the weekend was not an official part of the championship - a special challenge race between Britain's two Olympic gold medallists Duncan Goodhew and David Wilkie, former Olympic champion Nobuti Taguchi, Japan, and current world champion Walter Kusch of West Germany. It was a 110 yard breaststroke event created for television to draw public attention to the concept of Masters Swimming in Britain. And what a race it turned out to be with Goodhew, leading from the gun and winning in an amazing time of 1:02.87 although he had not trained seriously for 5 months. Wilkie, himself, had every reason to feel pleased with his time of 1:04.91, having dashed from his other duty as World of Sport television commentator to the starting block.

Among the other highlights of the championship: the freestyle sprint races in the 25-29 age

groups which saw Beckenham's international sprinter Andy Wood closely challenge the top Americans; the duels between Jack Hale and Peter Heatly in the backstroke events in the 55-59; the pool-side excitement generated by the sight of Jack Hale swimming the dolphin butterfly stroke he created; a new masters' world record by Willy van Rysel; the 100 m individual medley won by Bruce Furness in a spectacular duel with David Wilkie; the sight of 3 former Presidents of the S.S.A. and Director of Coaching Ron Braund competing in their events.

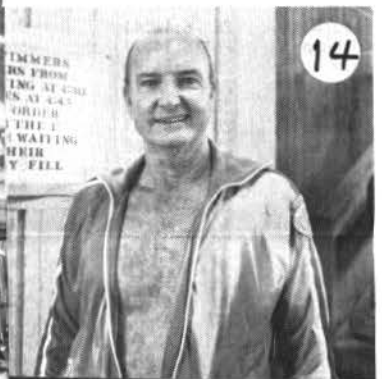
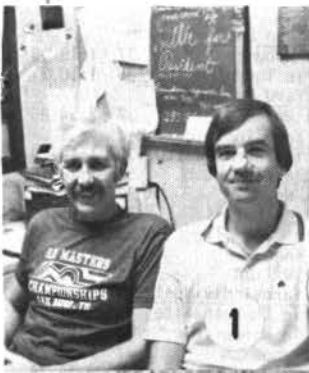
The second Scottish Masters, sponsored by Kalback Lager in conjunction with Inverclyde District Council, was clearly, a success, and a boost for the idea of masters swimming in this country. It also established a clear need for the A.S.A. to talk it up officially at national and regional level following the pioneering efforts of Otter S.C. and Gateshead Council who in 1981 hold their 4th Northern Masters Championships.

MEDICAL FACTS AND NEWS - Theodore W. Johnson

Among the "goodies" passed out at the recent West Coast L.C. Nationals, to every swimmer, was a yellow sheet which extolled the virtues of "Pangamate" (or B-15) which the Russians especially praise for heart patients. This advertisement quoted a number of doctors by excerpts from an article in New York Magazine, March 13, 1978. There is no way to tell how many of the over 900 participants fell for that ad and paid \$9 for a hundred of the "miraculous" cure all.

A monthly digest of medical facts and news called "HEALTH-WISE" issued a warning against "PANGAMATE/B-15" in its Vol 3, No 9 issue for September 1980. Alexander Grant, M.D., the editor, based his paragraph against "Pangamic Acid/B-15" on a quotation from the Journal of the American Medical Association (243:2473, 1980) which said producers can throw anything they want into a bottle and label it B-15 or pangamic acid. The Journal said that the food and drug administration is prosecuting distributors who handle it and is seizing it from health food stores. The FDA tested the two most available brands and found they contain substances which, after being swallowed, turn into some of the most cancer producing substances known.

The FDA will act to remove PANGAMIC ACID from the market for public protection. They filed two court cases and won them both. Other names are "pangamate, Vitamin B-15, B-15" and the exact chemical makeup varies considerably and has not been properly tested as a drug or a food additive. Be sure to consult with your doctor before using "Pangamate".

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Swimming News

WHAT'S IN A NAME? Just about everything with the newly formed organization for swimming - namely - United States Swimming. There is considerable confusion at the present writing relating to the administration of Masters Swimming at the local level. The Local Swimming Committee (LSC) does not govern Masters Swimming but in some cases, Masters Swimming is a part of the LSC. Each USS/AAU association should form a Local Masters Swimming Committee-LMSC. Many have already been formed. Each LMSC should have a Registration Chairman.....

AAU SERVICE BUREAU - Some National Governing Bodies have contracted with the AAU to use their services and Masters Swimming is one of the Sports that have contracted with the AAU to use their services as has USS. So for 1981 all Member Clubs with Masters Swimmers will pay a Membership Fee. All Masters Swimmers shall be registered. All Masters Swimming Meets shall be sanctioned. This can best be done by going through the LSC or the USS/AAU Association. Forms will be available for registrations, sanctions, transfers, etc. Going directly through the AAU Service Bureau will cost each athlete an additional fee. If you have questions: 1) contact your Masters Swimming Chairman; 2) contact your LSC; 3) contact your USS/AAU Association Secretary; 4) contact the National Registration Chairman for Masters Swimming - Adrienne Pipes, 1214 Nolan Ave., Chula Vista, CA 92011; or 5) National Chairman, Ted Haartz, 155 Pantry Rd., Sudbury, MA 01776..

INSURANCE - The AAU has a Comprehensive Liability insurance policy - a comprehensive general liability and bodily injury policy which is paid for proportionately by the Associations. Limits are one million dollars plus one million excess coverage for any single occurrence with no deductible. Entities covered: The AAU of the U.S., Inc. (and its NGB's), National Sport

Governing Bodies (and its Local Sport Committees), AAU Associations (and its member clubs) and Sponsors/hosts of AAU events. All AAU sanctioned events are covered. If a certificate of insured is required by a sponsor/host or the facility of a sanctioned AAU event, request a certificate request form from the Secretary of your Association. This is not an accident or health policy, it's a liability policy to protect the aforementioned entities from liability claims in case of lawsuits or proven liability. If at some AAU sanctioned event, something occurs which might make any of the entities covered liable for some type of damages, then you should report the facts and circumstances immediately to 1) AAU headquarters in writing; 2) by phone to your nearest local INA office; and 3) by phone to our Broker at 415/938-7727. In such occurrence, never admit any liability to parties involved or give any details (limits, etc.) on our coverage. In 1981 each registered athlete will have the Athlete's insurance included with his registration.....
